This is a joint petition filed by petitioners Dilip Kumar Das and Barnali Das u/s 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 for a decree of dissolution of their marriage on mutual consent.

It is averred in the petition that both the petitioners got married on 03.05.2018 as per Hindu rites and rituals and after marriage, both of them realized that there was serious difference in their attitude and living style which created no compatibility. Consequently, both of them parted their company from each other since December, 2019. Both the petitioners could not adjust with each other due to temperamental difference and their marriage has broken down irretrievably and it not possible for them to live as husband and wife any ore. There is no issue out of their wedlock. All the efforts of reconciliation between the petitioners to continue the present marriage have failed. Both the parties have realized that there is no chance to reconcile and they have finally decided for dissolution of their marriage on mutual consent. Hence, this joint petition was filed.

I have heard the learned counsel for the petitioners. Both the petitioners have filed their examination in chief on affidavit and I have perused the same.

Both the petitioner and respondent have been examined for a settlement on reconciliation but in vain.

In view of the joint petition filed by the petitioners as well as on their testimony on affidavit, I find that there is no impediment in granting the decree for dissolution of marriage on mutual consent as prayed for. Hence, the petition is allowed and the marriage of the petitioners is dissolved from today by granting the decree of dissolution of marriage on mutual consent.

Draw up the decree accordingly within the prescribed period of time.

This case is thus disposed of.
